Penn State posted its highest total offense in 13 years and six players scored touchdowns as the No. 22 Nittany Lions rolled past Coastal Carolina, 66-10, in their season opener in Beaver Stadium. The victory was the 373rd in Joe Paterno's career, as he tied Florida State coach Bobby Bowden for the all-time lead among major college coaches. Penn State courses play host to United Way tournament
Friday, August 29, 2008
One of the largest annual special events for the Centre County United Way takes place Monday, Sept. 15, when the Penn State/Centre County United Way Golf Tournament swings into action at the Penn State golf courses. The 10-year-old event, which benefits the 37 United Way member agencies in Centre County, has raised more than \$182,000 since its inception in 1998. The inaugural event produced \$8,600 and last year's total was \$33,645. Penn State has a strong history of supporting the Centre County United Way, which has been identified as the "charity of choice" for University employees, meaning that faculty and staff are encouraged to support the United Way through the annual employee fund-raising campaign. 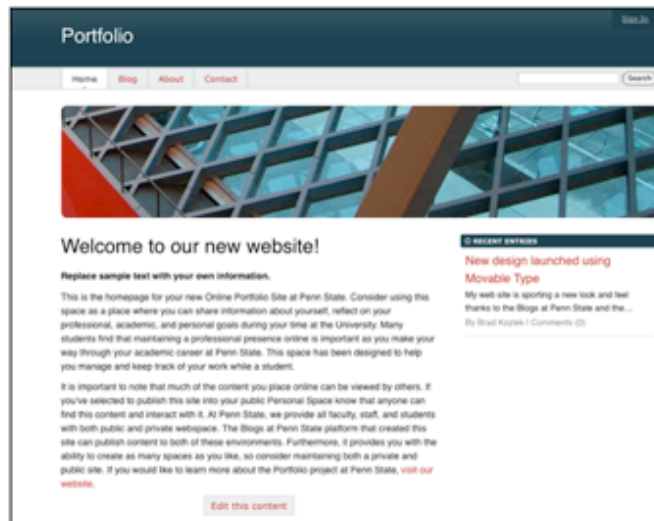

Blogs At Penn State now powered by Movable Type 4.2

On the morning of Monday, August 25th, Blogs At Penn State was updated to Movable Type 4.2.

Current users of Blogs At Penn State will not have to take any action for the upgrade. Movable Type 4.2 features changes under the hood to improve stability and security. Movable Type 4.2 also features the ability to create blogs based on various templates such as the "Professional Website" template set. What is a Blog?

A blog is a simple to use tool that empowers you to publish online quickly and easily. Simply stated, it is a website that you can easily update and contribute to from anywhere you have an Internet connection. A blog is a place for personal reflection, a place to take notes, share pictures, publish your movies, and anything else that you can dream. It belongs to you and you have the power to make it whatever you choose.

Remember, for the time being, this is a pilot. To get started, [simply log in and get publishing](#). If you need help getting started or want to learn more about the project take a look at the [Community Hub](#).

Create your Blog

[Getting started](#) is actually really easy. A few minutes after logging in you'll be ready to publish your blog. The Penn State Blog platform takes advantage of your Penn State Personal Webspace so all your files are stored where you can get to them.

After you log in, you'll see your personal Blog Dashboard where you'll be able to create and manage as many blogs as you choose. Want a blog for a course? One for sharing pictures? One for random thoughts? No problem. The Penn State Blog platform lets you decide what you want to share.

Getting started is easy. When you are ready, just take a look at some of the getting started materials and you'll be creating your blog in no time at all.

With the upgrade of the Blogs at Penn State in Spring 2008, users who had created blogs in the older version can access both systems.

A Whirlwind Weekend In Georgetown

So this past weekend I drove down from State College, Pa to Georgetown in Washington, DC with Matt Kuhner, a good friend of mine from high school. We were visiting another longtime friend, **Eric Snyder**, who's living in Georgetown this summer while on an internship for Capital One.

I've been to Washington many times before, and seen all the major sights from the White House to the Lincoln Memorial. This visit, though, was a special one for me. It was the first time I've spent any significant time in Georgetown, which is an historic and gorgeous part of the city that I've come to adore.

Georgetown is what I consider the "classical America" area of the district with more high end shops and boutiques than you can count, but it's **charm** is evident in block after block of historic buildings and colonial homes. (In fact, during a previous visit two years ago, I **visited** the Old Stone House. Built in 1765, it's the oldest standing building in the district.)

We arrived late on Friday any enjoyed the pleasant but muggy weather, heading out after lunch on Saturday and heading to the heart of the city. I was moved by a massive community effort by a local service organization to provide food, shelter and bathroom facilities to the homeless population. It's a humbling reminder that the capital of the greatest nation in the history of mankind still struggles with very human problems of destitution.

Later we attending an early Mass at Holy Trinity Church, the same one attended by President John F. Kennedy and recently in the news for Tim Russert's funeral Mass. The church takes up about an entire city block with the **modern church** and **original chapel**, along with **gardens** and a **recreation area**.

Above the entrance to the chapel is a **beautiful stained glass** representation of the nature of the Holy Trinity — the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit or Pater, Filius and Spiritus Sanctus. The Mass itself was exceptional with a thoughtful Homily delivered by, I believe, Fr. Gregory A. Schenden, S.J.

He referenced a passage by **Fr. Ron Rolheiser** on the reality that, too often, "the pious are not liberal" in and "the liberal are not pious." The challenge, he asserted, was to strive for a life that successfully blends the two.

I captured the last portion of the closing organ music **on video**, as has become a habit when visiting other churches. After Mass we were struck by a **sign affixed to the door** of the church as we left with



Graham must be somewhat concerned about the impact of the new facilities fee on his brand, because last night he engaged in a little public relations with at a UPUA meeting.

The University Park Undergraduate Association (UPUA) passed a resolution last night to create a student-based organization that will ultimately decide how the money from a new fee will be spent.

The decision on the facilities fee was made at the first UPUA general assembly meeting of the semester. The facilities fee is a \$50 per semester tax students pay to fund the construction of new projects on campus. Next year the fee will rise to \$100 per semester.

University President Graham Spanier spoke before the vote was made to offer his support to the group and their efforts.

Of course, he's in favor of this student-based group. It was Old Main's idea.

The facilities fee will grow by no more than the increased rate of tuition in subsequent years, noted [interim vice president for student affairs Gail] Hurley. In addition, an advisory group that includes student representation will provide input to help senior administrators determine the priorities for applying funds generated by the facilities fee. Ultimately, the Board of Trustees approves major building and renovation projects proposed by the administration.

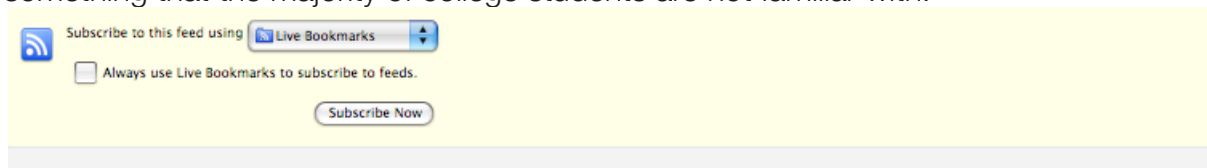

The LION 90.7fm: The Tale of the Senior Gift of the Class of 1951

I've been meaning for some time now to write up an entry here that explains more of the history of The LION 90.7fm at Penn State and our unique heritage. I've written before about our history, and student radio's founding in the 1950s thanks to the Senior Gift of the Class of 1951.

What makes the story of student radio at Penn State particularly interesting, though, is that no other class gift has been usurped or otherwise reclaimed, so to speak, in the history of our University.

I'll offer an abridged explanation, and can expand upon this in the future if there is interest. In the late 1970s through the 1980s, a contingent of faculty and administrators, tired on the lack of National Public Radio and PBS content in Central Pennsylvania, began exerting their influence more noticeably on the students of the campus station, by then called WPSU-FM. (The original call letters, WDFM, were ditched when "WPSU" became available for use at University Park.)



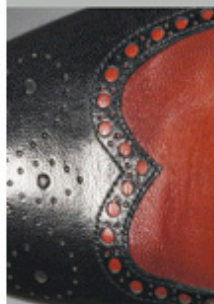
